THE RABBI SPEAKS

Dear Friends:

The Talmud teaches that a person who takes a single human life is compared to one who has destroyed the whole world. Each individual human life is of infinite value. Our minds struggle to comprehend the enormity of tragedy when an evil or mentally ill individual, armed to the teeth, callously kills scores of our fellow citizens

gathered for a country music concert or in worship.

After each of these events, many of our nation's leaders have extended "thoughts and prayers" to victims, survivors, and their families. Each time, some Americans have derided those "thoughts and prayers" as being devoid of the actions required to stop the violence, actions that some charge our leaders have been delinquent to take.

Prayer is action. With prayer, we ask God to weep with the mourners and our nation. With prayer, we ask God to guide the hands and the hearts of those entrusted with healing the injured. With prayer, we may ask God to sustain those who persist in advocacy to reduce gun violence. We may even pray that God reach in to our own hearts, to move us to activism.

Prayer and action are not mutually exclusive. For religious people, prayer and activism go hand in hand.

In late January, Eileen Hamilton and I plan to set out for Washington, D.C., chaperoning our Confirmation class at the L'taken Social Justice Seminar of the Religious Action Center of Reform Judaism. After a Shabbat of worship and study – and a weekend that includes advocacy training, an impactful visit to the U.S. Holocaust Memorial Museum, and an inspiring Havdalah service at the Jefferson Memorial – our students will present themselves atop Capitol Hill, where they will address their concerns to Senators Boozman and Cotton and Rep. Hill. Sen. Boozman has met with us personally each of the four years that I've led the group. Sen. Cotton met with us last year, too. And once we got a photo opportunity with Rep. Hill.

Twice, our students have chosen to advocate about gun violence. In each case, the students who called for stricter gun laws come from families who own guns. They expressed concern that loopholes in federal background check legislation and the wide availability of military-style weapons might one day threaten the gun rights of responsible Americans. As young people shocked by the tragic weight

of deaths attributable to the wide availability of guns in our society, they quoted Torah: "You shall not stand idly by while your neighbor bleeds" (Leviticus 19:9).

While our young people's pleas do not fall on deaf ears in our Arkansas congressional offices, Senators Boozman and Cotton do not suggest eagerness to end the "gun show loophole," for example. (Rep. Hill's staff seems authorized only to communicate our views and offer a neveryet-fulfilled commitment to send us a letter from him on the subject.) Our senators treat our students to respectful disagreement and fruitful conversation. Last year, Senator Boozman sought common ground by proposing that our nation needs to do more to care for those with mental illness. We agree. Regrettably, we have not seen action in that direction in Washington.

Please keep our Confirmation class, Eileen and me in your thoughts and prayers as we journey to our national's capitol once again, prepared to advocate on the basis of principles enunciated in Torah.

Dear Friends,

"Utter futility! - said Koheleth -Utter futility! All is futile!

What real value is there for a man

In all the gains he makes beneath the sun?" Ecclesiastes 1:2, TANAKH, JPS translation.

Why does Koheleth (Ecclesiastes) have such a dark outlook on life? Is it really dark? And what do these words have to do with my decision to become a Legacy Donor to Congregation B'nai Israel?

I love the book of Koheleth. From the opening verses quoted above, the book goes on to make many observations about what human beings experience during our life on this earth. The words are timeless, and the book contains some of the most beautiful poetry in all of literature. Far from being gloomy or pessimistic, Koheleth is simply making an observation we all know is true: we will not live forever. He goes on to ask a universal question: what - if anything- should we be doing during our brief sojourn among the living? And what - if anything - of us will endure when our time here is completed?

As most of you know, I came to Judaism as an adult. In Judaism I have found a challenge for my intellect, a home for my heart. A friend of mine, also a "Jew by choice", once remarked how grateful she was to have found Judaism because the religion taught her "how to live". Indeed, Judaism is all about how to live with integrity, respect, joy and compassion-come what may. These lessons are all there for us in Jewish history, culture, literature, and most of all, as lived experience in Jewish community.

I take nothing about my Jewish journey for granted. Those who came before me have made my journey possible. It is almost beyond imagining that the chain of Jewish history stretches back thousands of years from Koheleth to me! Could those who founded Congregation B'nai Israel have ever imagined they were building a community for someone like me? Could they know that I would think about them, and thank them for what they have made possible for me? Can you imagine whom you may affect by the legacy gift you leave for the future of Congregation B'nai Israel? "Indeed, man cannot guess the events that occur under the sun." Ecclesiastes 8:17.

Koheleth rightly observes that we will not take our gains with us once we leave this life; but when we leave a legacy for those who come after us, the very best part of us will live on in ways we can never even imagine.

FROM THE EDUCATOR

Each morning when religious school begins we have a brachah (moment of blessing) moment together. This is a time that we share a story and lesson about when to say various blessings. Then we say the blessing together. There is a tradition in Judaism to say 100 brachot (blessings) a day. For some this is a very doable thing to achieve each day, while for many of us, it seems out of the question to stop and say a blessing 100 times. But do we actually have to stop what we're doing to be thankful for what we have? It takes me back to the days of David Letterman's Top Ten Lists of the past. Seriously folks, why not list the Top Ten of the Day before going to sleep? Would it be that hard?

When I asked each student in religious school to say one thing they were really thankful for, you could probably name the obvious: life, family, friends, health, food. A few went deeper into personal items such as nerf guns and iPads...great answers too. At the moment of being asked on the spot, no one went deeper into what we just might take for granted each and every day.

Later in the morning, we played a short round of "would you rather" with our 6/7/8 graders. It made me think again...what would be better or worse? Would you rather not be able to read or speak for rest of your life? Questions like this are playful in nature of course, but what about the truth of the matter? What if?

So, next time we want to thank God for what we have...go ahead and name the obvious, it's OK. Then challenge yourself to a Top

Ten List for each day. Rivkah Lambert from Jewish Values Online gives these awesome suggestions to get started. Some of them are so obvious, while other answers are so personal. These are some that resonated with me as being "great" answers. I now feel that I could easily think of at least 100 more.

Baruch atah Adonai...Thank you God for...the ability to see color; for clean water to drink; the ability to read; ten fingers that all work; not having to save potato and carrot peels to eat; Shabbat and inviting friends for Shabbat; hot pizza that can be delivered to my house; the breeze; rain; avocadoes; getting home safely; being able to breathe on my own; my amazing brother; love stories; tissues; the ability to love; being able to laugh out loud...and now with this inspiration, don't you think you could add at least 100 more? I know you can. Try this at home: the top ten of the dinner table? The top ten before going to sleep? The top ten of the week? A brachah moment can happen at any time.








Ruthe & Phil's Legacy

Sisterhood would no longer sponsor onegs, flowers, miscellaneous grants or programming.


Our next meeting will be in January 21, 2018 to hold the final discussion and vote.
