THE RABBI SPEAKS

RABBI BARRY BLOCK

Dear Friends:

As we approach these High Holy Days, many Temple members long for the Temple Sanctuary but are not certain that they can feel safe worshiping in community while COVID-19's delta variant is so contagious and prevalent in Arkansas. Our COVID Task Force has recommended, and the Board of Trustees has adopted, policies intended to keep worshippers safe—at least congregants who are eligible to be vaccinated, have been vaccinated, and are not immunocompromised.



Still, everybody is entitled to their own comfort level and to their own assessment of risk. Many congregants, even if dearly wishing to be the Sanctuary, will choose to participate via livestream only. And for that, we may all be grateful to the Ottenheimer Brothers Foundation, which provided a grant that enabled us to upgrade our sound system and install the livestream system, and to the volunteers who operate that system.

I am reminded of a teaching from the Talmud—not about Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur, but about Sukkot: “All seven days of Sukkot, one treats the Sukkah as their permanent residence and their house as their temporary residence.”¹

Our sacred Sanctuary is the “permanent residence” of our congregation’s worship. Throughout the Covid-19 pandemic, though, we have become used to a new role for our own homes, which now constitute the extended “temporary residence” of our communal worship.

I would like to suggest, though, that we take a lesson from the Talmud and Sukkot. The sages imply that a patently temporary edifice, the fragile Sukkah that is erected for the holiday and dismantled when it ends, can be a “permanent residence” for a sacred period of time.

On these High Holy Days, I pray that we who can worship in the Sanctuary will rejoice in that “permanent residence” of our congregation, taking the unique pleasure that comes from being there after not having prayed there often if at all for eighteen months.

I acknowledge that those worshipping at home may be disappointed. At the same time, I would emphasize that our tradition calls each of our homes a *mikdash m'at*, a small sanctuary. One can make it more so with flowers, perhaps, or a beautifully set table, even for one. Then, each home can be, for these High Holy Days at least, the “permanent residence” of our congregation’s worship.

Then, five days after Yom Kippur, Sukkot begins, and we will celebrate in our brand-new Sukkah. That Sukkah will become the permanent residence of our congregation for a week, and more of us may feel comfortable gathering there, since it is outdoors.

Wherever we worship, may all feel that we are very much at home.

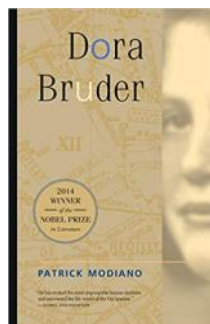

Dear Friends,

As you are reading this we are in the middle of the High Holiday season. However you have chosen to join us for services, through in person, streaming, or a combination of both, I wish you and your family *L'Shanah Tova*, a good and happy New Year ahead.

As we prepared for the High Holidays last year, everything felt new and awkward. Streaming was new, being at home was still a bit of a novelty, and no one knew what to expect. Here we find ourselves a year later. We are (almost) experts at streaming, we have developed procedures and protocols for gathering together while staying safe, and we are gathering.

I want to take a moment and thank all of you for bearing with our covid protocols, rules, and needs. While we are still being careful, this gathering together we are able to do now would not be possible without input and suggestions from our congregants, along with the expertise of those serving on the COVID Task Force.

This allows everyone Temple access in the way that they are most comfortable with. We also hope to find ways to gather together outdoors as the weather cools off.

We are, and continue to be, a *Kehilah Kedosha*, a Holy Community. Thank you to everyone for being a part of that.

Join Us for *Tashlich* on Rosh Hashanah Afternoon

Tashlich is a Rosh Hashanah ritual, in which we toss breadcrumbs, representing our sins, into a body of running water, with the symbolic hope that our sins are carried far from us, out to sea. It's a moment of contemplation—and this year, a time when children and individuals of all ages can gather safely outdoors to observe the Holy Day together.



Tashlich is scheduled for Tuesday, September 7, at 4pm, at Allsopp Park, 3700 Cedar Hill Road. The site is well marked, and parking is close and easily accessible to the creek.

Rabbi Block will frame the ritual, and Merrick Fagan will sound the shofar. Masks are required. Water bottles will be provided. Many thanks to Laurie Arnold, Jana Cohen, and Carol Parham for arranging *Tashlich* this year on behalf of the Ritual Committee.
