THE RABBI SPEAKS

RABBI BARRY BLOCK

Dear Friends:

When I was in rabbinical school at Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion (HUC-JIR), my gay and lesbian classmates faced terrible discrimination on campus. Some faculty members argued that these classmates' sexual orientation should bar them from ordination and mistreated them accordingly.



I was active among students advocating for our gay and lesbian classmates, and we were relieved if not entirely satisfied when, months before our ordination, HUC-JIR finally announced that sexual orientation would not be a sole reason to deny admission or ordination.

What I did not know when I was at HUC-JIR was that my female classmates routinely faced gender-based degradation and humiliation. And I also did not know that the President of HUC-JIR committed multiple acts of sexual assault or that my Talmud professor at the Los Angeles campus repeatedly sexually harassed and intimidated female students and staff members. As Rabbi Brian Stoller has said, paraphrasing Genesis 28:16, "Darkness was in that place, and I did not know it."

In the intervening years, though, women rabbis have shared with me the pain and indignity heaped upon them by professors, senior colleagues, and community members. I also know that gay and lesbian—and now, also transgender—rabbinic students and rabbis, as well as students and rabbis of color, have continued to face degradation.

In November, Morgan Lewis, a law firm engaged by HUC-JIR, released a searing report, detailing discrimination, favoritism, sexual harassment, and sexual assault at our Reform seminary over the course of five decades. The report includes details of sexual misconduct by six faculty members, two of them presidents of HUC-JIR. Four of the six are deceased but were in good standing at HUC-JIR until their deaths. The other two were ousted from their positions because of their sexual misconduct.

HUC-JIR is not the only institution of Reform Judaism facing a reckoning with history of not properly confronting male rabbis who abused their positions for sexual gratification. The Central Conference of American Rabbis (CCAR) and our Union for Reform Judaism have also engaged law firms, charging them to seek information broadly and to issue reports. The report from CCAR's law firm, Alcalaw, more likely to focus on the ethics process than on individual offenders, may be issued this month.

Some have argued that names of offenders should not be shared publicly, observing that deceased offenders cannot defend themselves and that their deaths atone for any sins.

However, our Reform Movement—indeed, our society—cannot move past sexual misconduct and the damage it causes without honestly confronting the past. I am mindful that the Israelites were slaves in Egypt for more than four hundred years, and yet God called Moses to lead them to freedom only after they cried out in anguish.

This year, let us attune our ears to the pain and suffering of too many women in our midst. Then, like the Children of Israel, may we all be free.


