# THE RABBI SPEAKS RABBI BARRY BLOCK

In other venues, I have written and spoken about the moral challenges of and Jewish position regarding the abortion ban that will take effect in Arkansas as soon as Roe v. Wade is overturned, which appears to be imminent. I have also



raised my voice against the Arkansas law that would forbid parents and medical professionals from providing gender-affirming health care to transgender youth. Thanks to a federal court injunction, that law is not currently in force, but we cannot be assured that the federal courts will continue to protect the transgender youth among us.

Major employers have made their concerns clear: They wonder whether they will be able to attract high quality employees to Arkansas and other states that have such laws, and they worry that new business will not move to Arkansas and other states with these laws, because they will not want to subject their employees to them.

The type of employees and potential employees about whom these major employers are concerned are the very same people who would be likely to consider membership in Congregation B'nai Israel. **Our congregation's membership may suffer as a result of Arkansas' repressive laws.** 

I do not mean to suggest that the most significant problem with these terrible laws is one facing employers or our congregation as an institution. **Citizens of Arkansas, including members of Congregation B'nai Israel, may suffer personally as a result of these terrible laws.**

Moreover, I turn 59 this month, and I do not anticipate getting any younger. One day, Congregation B'nai Israel will be searching for a rabbi to succeed me. As members of the Search Committee that brought me here in 2013 can tell you, attracting a rabbi to Arkansas is challenging under the best of circumstances. That problem may be considerably worse going forward. Rabbis who may become pregnant, or who have or may have children, may be very reluctant to move to a state where their rights and their children's rights may be impinged.

I do not mean to suggest that rabbis would suffer more from these laws than other Arkansans, or that Jewish people considering a move here would suffer more than others who might be offered a position in Arkansas. I **do** mean to say that Reform Jews, and particularly Reform rabbis, will be most conscious of these restrictions on their rights and therefore more reluctant than some others to relocate here. The harm to our congregation's membership, and ultimately to its ability to attract a quality rabbi, may be significant.

I pray that more compassionate heads and hearts will prevail in the days, months, and years to come.
