THE RABBI SPEAKS Rabbi Barry Block



Dear Friends,

Congregation B'nai Israel has been richly blessed over the course of two years by the voice and by the presence of our inaugural E. Lee Ronnel

Student Cantor, Aleksandra Dubov. As we prepare for Cantor Dubov's service to our congregation to come to an end, I hope that you will join me to celebrate Cantor Dubov at a Kiddush Luncheon in her honor on May 31, following Shabbat morning services.

We have much to celebrate.

When Cantor Dubov came to us in August 2023, she was new to cantorial school, having just completed Hebrew Union College's Year in Israel program. At the same time, we were new to hosting a cantorial student for weekend visits, but even more than that, **Cantor Dubov has been the first sustained cantorial presence in our congregation's 159 year history!**

Amidst the dizzying array of coursework and recitals that over-fill a cantorial student's schedule, Cantor Dubov relentlessly mustered the energy to serve our congregation with her heart and soul. She was eager to learn our congregation's customs and to lead services with me in a way that would be familiar to all in attendance.

Then, our student cantor did something even better: She challenged us. She has offered us the opportunity to consider new styles of prayer and worship music. She has provided inspiring and stimulating recitals as sermons-in-song. She has interacted with each Bar or Bat Mitzvah and their family, enhancing the beauty and meaning of their special Shabbat celebrations. And she has enhanced the *ruach*, the spirit, in our Religious School, building Jewish music literacy among the children of our congregation.

When I was in my second and third years of rabbinical student in Los Angeles, I served a congregation in Edmonton, Alberta, Canada on a biweekly basis. I loved that community, and I remain connected to several members. Still, over the course of two years, the travel became exhausting, even for a twenty-four-year-old! Air travel has not become easier in the last thirty-five years, and Cantor Dubov is getting married this summer. She needs a placement closer to home, and she has found one. The Village Temple will be blessed to have her, and it's a short walk from Hebrew Union College.

This month, our congregation will enjoy Cantor Dubov's presence twice—May 16-18, when she will lead as solo clergy while I'm away celebrating my son Daniel's college graduation, and May 30-June 2, an extended visit for Shabbat and Shavuot, including Confirmation.

Meet our E. Lee Ronnel Cantor for 2025-26: Cantor Lisa Levine



Congregation B'nai Israel will be blessed to welcome Cantor Lisa Levine as our E. Lee Ronnel Cantor for 2025-26. Cantor Levine's first visit with us is scheduled for August 23-25, and she is slated to be with us for twelve weekends through June 2026, with ten of these weekends including Religious School on Sunday morning.

Cantor Levine builds bridges through music within and between communities as a composer, author, poet, chaplain, yoga teacher & worship artist. Cantor Lisa hails from Bakersfield, California, where she began playing guitar at the age of 8 and singing in her Temple Beth El choir! She was a UAHC Camp Song Leader and NFTY officer in her youth group. Lisa went on to earn her B.A. from University of California-Irvine and spent her Junior year abroad in Israel, studying at the Reuben Academy of Music and Hebrew University in Jerusalem. Cantor Lisa went on to graduate school from the Hebrew Union College's Debbie Friedman School of Sacred Music, where she earned her Cantorial Ordination.

In her varied career, Cantor Levine has served large and small congregations around the country and become a well-known composer of Jewish worship and healing music. Her catalogue includes 12 CD recordings and a choral series published by Transcontinental Music Publications. Her Book/DVD/CD Yoga Shalom was published in 2011 by URJ Press. A 500-hour registered Yoga teacher, Cantor Levine has become known for her Yoga embodiment meditation practices and sacred chant. Her poetry appears in dozens of publications, including *The Torah: A Women's Torah Commentary*, and *Women of Reform Judaism's Covenant of the Heart* series among many others. Her most recent CD, *This Holy Place*, is a journey of the spirit which includes anthems and prayers for everyday mourning and celebration!

Ordained as Rabbinic Pastor through Aleph Alliance for Jewish Renewal, Cantor Lisa serves as a chaplain at assisted living and nursing homes and hospitals in Montgomery County, Maryland. She has led seven Humanitarian Jewish Missions to Cuba and lectures and performs about her many concerts there. Cantor Lisa serves on the National Board of Ezra Uganda Assistance, a non-profit dedicated to supporting the faithful Jewish village of Namutumba in Uganda. She also volunteers her time on the Boards of the Rabbinic Pastors Association and Aleph Board of Governors. Cantor Lisa lives in Brookeville, MD north of Washington D.C., where she shares her life with her husband Andy, grown children Emily and Louis, puppies Elliot and Frankie and a lazy tomcat Gizmo.

From Lewis Krain, President

This may surprise people who know me (or maybe not) but despite being an extrovert, I'm really a homebody. I prefer to spend my free time in my own space, reading or watching TV or playing games. Once I'm at home, it takes a lot to get me out of the house again. Being in a leadership role of Congregation B'nai Israel has pushed me to engage in a lot more activities than I'm generally used to.

All that is by way of confession that I wasn't really looking forward to going to the Congregational Seder two weeks ago. Passover is one of my favorite holidays because it's celebrated at home (see above paragraph), so going out to the Temple mid-week to do a big event Seder didn't seem up my alley. Nevertheless, it's one of my duties to represent the Board at these events, and I think it's critical to be there to support the Rabbi, staff, and volunteers who put so much work into every one of them.

What ended up happening was a scenario that has unfolded for me several times since I've become president: I felt obligated to attend an event, I showed up a little hesitant, and then I ended up glad I had invested the time. I had a really good time at the seder. The crowd was in a great mood, the Rabbi led the service with a sense of casual fun, and the food was excellent. I sat with some people who I don't normally get a chance to spend much time with and I learned a bit about them and their Passover traditions.

It's become apparent to me that before I took this role, I had only scratched the surface of what our congregation offers. Being president has been a lot of work, but I'm grateful that it's shown me the depth of our events and programming. There is so much going on at the Temple, from holiday celebrations to Torah study to adult learning to cultural exploration and discussion. I don't expect everyone to do all of these things, but I wonder if, like me, some people don't always take the opportunity to give these events a chance to impress them. So for this month I issue a challenge: I challenge you to bring yourself to one event you wouldn't normally attend, and see if you gain a new perspective from it. Shoot me an email and let me know how it went, or just tell me when you see me there, even if I do look a little hesitant at that particular moment...

April at Congregation B'nai Israel Religious School!

What was it like all those years ago in Egypt, when the Israelites began gathering their supplies for a leap of faith into the unknown? One can imagine the anxious feelings, mixed with the joy that can only come with a first taste of freedom after centuries in bondage. After a fun and flour-filled J-Food session with our Religious School, I can say that excitement and trepidation were certainly the order of the day for us!

It seems simple: take flour and a bit of water, mix it thoroughly, roll flat and bake. But there's just one catch: The entire process can only take 18 minutes! Fingers and forks were flying, and a stopwatch (certainly historically accurate) kept time as we rushed our fresh matzot into the oven, gave them a flip, and finished the baking, all before any leavening could occur.

There's something special about seeing an ancient tradition being practiced by our next generation. It brings a newness to the ritual to everyone involved and serves as a reminder that our children are not only the builders of the future, but the keepers of our past. We didn't quite make enough for 40 years in the desert, but the foundations were laid for 40 years (and more!) of learning.



We all have a responsibility to report and respond to antisemitism or hate when we see it.

TO REPORT AN ANTISEMITIC OR HATE INCIDENT, VISIT:

ADL.ORG/REPORTINCIDENT-KULANU

IF YOU FEAR FOR YOUR SAFETY OR THE SAFETY OF OTHERS, CALL 9-1-1 IMMEDIATELY.

What should I report?

You should report any incident you perceive as antisemitic, biased or hateful.

Here are some examples:

- Antisemitic or other hateful graffiti in public places, including synagogues and schools.
- Vandalism of religious artifacts such as mezuzahs or menorahs and holy places.
 Online harassment, including hateful social media posts and emails. Remember to take a
- screenshot!
- Verbal harassment, including emails and voicemails.
 Media-based incidents, including antisemitic or hateful content in a news story.
- White supremacist propaganda.
