THE RABBI SPEAKS RABBI BARRY BLOCK



Dear Friends,

Lewis Krain did not become President of Congregation B'nai Israel as most of his predecessors did. Yes, Lewis "signed up" to be President, accepting the position of Executive Vice President for

2024-26, anticipating assuming the presidency in 2026. However, he became President rather suddenly, during a late Friday afternoon Zoom meeting in December 2024, at a difficult time in the life of our congregation.

Lewis's first task was to heal a fractured congregation. Recognizing the limits to which that goal could be achieved, Lewis went about that work diligently and patiently, with reasonable expectations. He met with Temple members who were upset with the Executive Committee and with him personally. He listened. Congregants felt heard, even when they did not agree.

To a greater extent, the healing Lewis brought was through a consistent non-anxious presence. If Lewis gets rattled, I have not seen it. Your rabbi gets rattled, and I'm not alone. Lewis's calming influence made a huge difference. Lewis has been at Temple virtually every Friday night of his presidency, always with a smile, always with a warm greeting for each person, always with enthusiasm for Temple programs and services.

As Michael Roberts and Luke Frauenthal joined our staff, Lewis made a point to welcome them

personally and then to make himself available to them. He has been an invaluable thought partner to Michael, Luke, and me, as we have navigated a wide range of challenges, many of them exciting, unique opportunities, but others more fraught. He approached the growing needs of our magnificent but aging Temple building with good humor.


Perhaps best of all, Lewis modeled accepting a setback without letting it become a catastrophe. He consistently put one foot in front of the other, encouraging the rest of us to do the same, in good times and bad—and, as a result, the good times increased.

Lewis built camaraderie—first, in the Executive Committee, which was under duress when he took office but also increasingly bonded. Over time, Lewis’s infectious kindness brought the Board toward working together as a team and led to good feeling throughout the congregation.

Leading a Jewish organization is not easy. People have strong opinions because we all care about the Temple’s sacred mission. When people feel that their synagogue veers from sacred principles, they are naturally unsettled or worse. With unanimity neither common nor always desirable, conflict can ensue. With steady leadership, infused with kindness and good humor, and with a longstanding history of stability, Congregation B’nai Israel has thrived throughout these last eighteen months.

We owe a tremendous debt of gratitude to Lewis Krain, for being exactly the president we needed when it turned out that we needed him. Please join me in celebrating his service at our Annual Congregational Meeting on June 16.

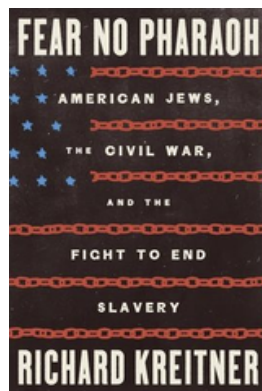

FROM LEWIS KRAIN

This is my last President's Column. It has been an honor serving, though it was much different than what I expected when I signed up. I do feel that in a lot of ways I was the right person for the tasks that arose during my tenure, and I think that Shelly Baron is 100% the right person for the tasks that are upcoming in the next term. There are too many people to thank individually in this column, but it's obvious that this job could not even exist without the Rabbi and the Executive Committee. I have been blessed with a Board of Trustees that has my two most valued traits, Wisdom and Humor. I owe so much to anyone who took the lead on a project, committee, or event; we depend so much on the work of these folks. I'd like to share some things I've learned from doing this job...

There is an activity for everyone here: I'm amazed at the range of activities at CBI. Our normal prayer routines require music, food prep, A/V, & tech. We have collected a rich history of Arkansas Jewry that is tended by volunteer archivists. We have a physical building that needs care and maintenance, as well as ever-increasing security needs. We have educational programming across the lifespan, and cultural events with a worldwide focus. Whatever your interest or skill set, there's a way to bring it to CBI, and the people who do so are our lifeblood.

Congregation B'nai Israel is a family: There are so many kinds of people who come to worship here; we draw different backgrounds, personalities, politics, and outlooks. We certainly don't all agree on everything, but we're all bound together by our shared journey of Reform Judaism in Arkansas and our love of this congregation. It's inspiring to see people forge relationships at the Temple who would have had no reason to interact at all in any other setting. Like any family, we can bicker and have spats, but if we remember our connection we'll always come back to the table (or dining hall).

Our number one need is leadership: CBI is blessed with a depth of resources. We have congregants with a wide range of skills and talents, and a stable of volunteers that are willing to throw their backs behind any project. But throughout my term my biggest struggle has been finding leaders for these things. The same brave folks plan the events, chair the committees, and helm the projects. If you've not yet taken a leadership role here, please take the leap and step forward; you'll find the support is excellent (thanks Luke and Michael) and it's a lot easier than it looks. I'm certainly glad I said yes to the call from Bruce Greenberg.

I wish I'd listened more: The Temple is important, and like anything that's important, people sometimes disagree about what's best for it. A position that can seem clearly wrong is usually rooted in a reasonable concern from another viewpoint. I wish I'd taken more time to just listen to understand these perspectives.

Anyway, I'll be signing off now. I'll leave you with another thing that I'll miss greatly as I transition to Past President: the view of this wonderful collection of people seen from the Bimah every Shabbat and holiday. I cannot express the pride I feel looking out at you and knowing I was chosen to represent such a warm, talented, and amazing community of people. Thank you for an amazing term as President.

RELIGIOUS SCHOOL NEWS

Unlike many people, I am not a fan of travel – I have always been the quintessential homebody. When the phrase “staycation” gained in popularity a few years ago, I felt seen in a way that I’ve seldom felt. This is the source of endless amusement to friends, family, and colleagues alike. I don’t travel, I go to bed early, and I am utterly happy with that way of life.

But like any good rule, this one has exceptions, and one of my favorites is coming up at the end of June: the Institute for Southern Jewish Life Southern and Jewish 2026 conference. This yearly educational gathering brings together educators, clergy, lay leaders, parents, synagogue board members, and others to network, attend seminars, worship together, and have a good time for a shared purpose: celebrating Jewish life and education in the South.

I’ve written several times over the past year about the experience I had with three of our Religious School faculty members (Grade K-1 teacher Lee Harris, Grade 2-3 teacher Heather Tolliver, and Grade 4-5-6 co-teacher Findley) in Jackson, and this year we’ve decided to get the band back together and head all the way to Charlotte, North Carolina for the 2026 get-together.

Being an ISJL partner congregation has been a wonderful experience for us who work so hard to keep Religious School going. From curriculum that spans topics from prayer, love of Israel, social justice, and our place as Jews in the wider world to programs like the *Chanukah Maccabia* we held with Community Manager Valerie Klein, we’ve tapped into a wealth of resources to make sure our students get the most out of their time each Sunday.

Last year’s conference saw us attending classes which covered things like modern midrash, coping with modern antisemitism, working music into classes more effectively, and a particularly fun session with the Museum of the Southern Jewish Experience where we

explored how to bring historical artifacts to life for our students. It was a whirlwind experience that our teachers and I still talk about when discussing our plans for Religious School, and I have no doubt this year’s conference will be more of the same excellence.

This year’s theme is B’yachad – “All Together Now,” and there’s never been a more vital time for Jews to come together. We’re all looking forward to seeing faces we met last year, meeting new people, and bringing back another year’s worth of enthusiasm for next year’s Religious School term!

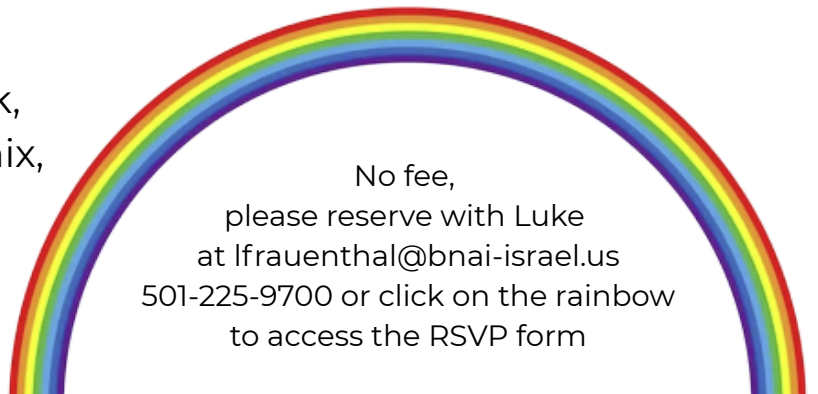
